



A Note From the Pastor,

One of the many discoveries I made while in North Pole, AK, was that you needed to adjust your magnetic compass. Here in Fargo we are used to the magnetic North as being pretty close to true North (at least not enough for us ground pounders to worry about). There, not that I used a compass to get around (they do have roads), the difference between magnetic North and true North is about 26°. That is a significant difference.

Which brings me to the role as your interim pastor. One of my "jobs" as your interim is to try to learn what and why you do what you do. That's where the good "difference" comes in. I ask a lot of questions. Hopefully, I do it in a nonthreatening way with you and your group or ministry so that I may learn what it is you do and why you do it. My assumptions may be way off (like 26°), that's why I ask. And we all know what happens when we assume! I certainly don't want to go off in one direction, assuming you are going the same, only to discover you are going in a different direction. 26° off target is still a miss.

Our major goal together is to call your next pastor. That is my target and hopefully yours. And not just any pastor. We want the right next pastor. So we will work thru the steps required – gathering information, collating and filling out forms, interviewing and hosting prospective candidate(s). It will be time consuming and costly, but the calling your next pastor is vital to the future ministry of St. John Lutheran.

On a personal note: I'm still a little off! While I strive for perfection – it will never happen. While I'd like to hit every note perfectly in the liturgies - that has yet to occur in my ministry. While I'd like to remember names of people I've just met – I've even forgotten my brother's name when I tried to introduce him – now my spouse, Bunny, I most times remember! I love being here. I love learning to live and do ministry here at St. John Lutheran, Fargo, as we work toward calling your next pastor.


