We will continue our Lent series through April 5th. Lenten Suppers will be served from 5:30-6:30 pm



Our worship starts out with a tableau of Jesus with his 12 disciples and what has become known as his "Last Supper". We will have an opportunity to commune before we participate in the "Stripping of the Altar". The bare altar symbolizes our own emptiness without our Savior. Even the Christ (or Pascal) candle is removed and we leave in darkness and silence.

April 14 Good Friday-7pm

Good Friday is the most somber day in the Lutheran Church year. Good Friday is traditionally observed as the day Jesus Christ was put to death by crucifixion dying for our sins. We observe Good Friday as a means for quiet self-examination.

April 16 Easter Sunday -8:30 & 10:45 am

Our Festive worship of Christ's resurrection gives great contrast to when we last worshipped together. The sanctuary is transformed with color, sights and sounds of the great victory Christ has won for us. Easter Breakfast Potluck will be served for 9:30-10:30am. CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE: The Call Process is now in the "Interview Phase". The St. John Call Committee has reviewed the information of many pastors, narrowed that initial number of candidates to a few and has begun the interview process. We continue to gather additional information regarding those whom we've interviewed. We ask for your prayers as the committee nears deciding whom we recommend as St. John's next senior pastor. For your information: once the Call Committee decides on a pastor, that recommendation is forwarded to the Church Council. The Council needs to take action approving the pastoral selection, as well as approving a compensation package. That will be followed by a special congregational meeting where two votes will be taken. One for approving the new senior pastor and one for approving the compensation package. The Call Committee thanks all those who have helped during this process: the synod bishop and staff, Pastor Balaban, Pastor Hansen, and the staff of St. John. And, a thank you to those members of St. John who offered suggestions and recommendations during the process.

Committee Spotlight - Good Samaritan Committee

Meets: First Tuesday of the month at 6:30 The focus of the Good Samaritan Committee is to nurture the spiritual and physical well-being of our congregation and community through the activities and ministries we support, including:

St. John Foot Care Clinic "Happy Feet" invites Sanford Home Health Care to provide nail care at a cost of \$16 the third Tuesday of each month. Volunteers provide foot washing, massage, and parrafin bath. Coffee and fellowship are also a part of this event.

Stephen Ministry matches those in need of caring relationships with trained Stephen Ministers. We recently welcomed 4 new Stephen Ministers who have completed 50 hours of training.

Young At Heart provides a Christian fellowship for our senior members - "we are mature in years, but young in spirit." From September to May, this group meets the second Thursday of the month at 10:00 for programs of music and speakers of interest, such Beth Brantner of Lost and Found Ministry, who spoke about drug addiction in our community at our February gathering.

Jambalaya Quilters create baby quilts with a cross design, which are then presented as a special gift to baptismal families.

Prayer Shawl Ministry combines craftsmanship with prayer as several members of the congregation knit and crochet shawls while praying. These shawls are then distributed by our pastors to those in need of comfort and healing.

The Nursery offers families a comfortable, safe space to bring their children during worship. From September to May, confirmation students along with a parent staff the nursery; at other times parents are asked to stay with their child in the nursery.

We welcome anyone interested in being involved in any of these opportunities or with ideas for new ways to nurture the spiritual and physical well being of our congregation and community to join us!
