### ST. JOHN FOUNDATION REPORT

At the June 8<sup>th</sup> meeting of the St. John Lutheran Church Foundation Board, funding was approved in response to financial requests as follows:

-\$1,624: \$406 to each of three college students (from the Asleson Scholarship fund) and one seminary student (from the Foundation fund)

-\$1,300 to the St. John Youth Account toward chaperone expenses for the 2018 National Youth Gathering (from the Foundation fund)

- Operating budget giving is about \$19,000 less than last year at this time.
- Thanks to careful budget management by our staff, and salary savings in our interim period between senior pastors, we're currently covering our operating expenses.
