A Note from the Pastor...

Happy New Year!

I would imagine that at this point most of us have had ample time to recover from the holiday festivities. Perhaps for some, if not most of us, the tree has been returned to its box, the company has left, the new toys have been thoroughly played with, the leftovers eaten and the normal routine reestablished. Perhaps there is even a sense of relief having made it through another holiday in one piece. And as the house returns to a sense of normalcy once more, we are faced with the mountain of empty boxes and wrapping paper and all the new stuff that is supposed to make us all much happier.

As I've grown older, I've become more and more convinced that the accumulation of stuff ultimately brings little happiness. It almost seems that the contrary is true; that more stuff brings with it greater and greater unhappiness. Sure, temporarily we may receive that sense of heightened excitement as we receive that which we believe will make all our dreams come true, but within days to weeks that sense of joy fades and we are faced with an empty feeling once more. Therefore, in an attempt to find happiness, we identify that next best thing that will make us happy, and a vicious cycle is reinforced.

I think this basic truth gets communicated to us through many of those classic Christmas stories and movies, like *The Grinch* and *A Christmas Carol*. These stories are intended to remind us that our value and worth is not defined by the quantity of our stuff, but instead by the quality of our relationships.

Perhaps that is the reason the Christ child comes to us, to remind us that our worth and value is not defined by our stuff, but rather our relationships. There is a book that we read to our kids when they were younger called *The Quiltmaker's Gift*. This book tells the story of a king who has everything that anyone could ever possibly want, yet he is not happy. In fact, he craves more and more stuff in the hopes that the next best thing will bring happiness. As the book progresses, he hears word of a quilt maker who makes quilts for the poor and needy to keep them warm at night. Immediately the king demands one of her beautiful quilts for himself. However, she refuses to give him one until he has given away all that he owns.

Initially, the king refuses to give away any of his most cherished possessions, believing that the loss of his treasures will only bring him unhappiness. However, he discovers that as he gives away his treasures, happiness and joy fill his heart. The story, of course, ends with the king returning to his kingdom having traveled far and wide distributing his possessions. He returns as a transformed ruler who is now happy and content having found true happiness and meaning in giving out of abundance to those in deepest need.

As I sit here today mindful of another Christmas passed, I am also mindful that perhaps true happiness and joy comes not from merely receiving, but instead in the simplest act of giving. So, as you enter 2020 having once again received the greatest gift of all, the gift of life through Christ, may you in turn consider what you are willing to give to help reflect the love that God has so abundantly showered down upon you.

When I first read The Uninhabitable Earth, I could only handle small chunks at any given time because it was so anxiety-provoking. It was hard to imagine humans had been driving the planet off a cliff for so long that the best-case scenario involved a world constantly dealing with more frequent and intense weather phenomena, declining air quality, and massive food instability. Indeed, climate change is deceptive in that it seems somewhat innocuous on the surface. The statistics are scary, but everything looks okay, so how bad can it really be? In reality, climate change acts more like a cancer; it may lie dormant for years, but once it becomes active, its destruction can wreak havoc for generations to come. We've spent decades ignoring the warning signs, but now we're increasingly confronted with a haunting question: what next? In reading this book and studying climate change as a student researcher this summer, I can tell you there's no easy answer. We need to be more invested as a nation in renewable energy and carbon capture technology. We need to support candidates who recognize climate change as an imminent threat and are willing to work across the aisle to make progress. We need to reflect on what little changes we can all make in support of a better future, whether that be eating less meat, purchasing energy efficient lightbulbs, composting, or boycotting companies with harmful environmental practices. Lastly, we must not lose hope, because it's never too late to start moving in the right direction.

A Brief History of Faith Chest Ministry at St. John

You have likely seen Erin Bjerke presenting a quilt and Faith Chest to newly baptized members. Ever wonder how the Faith Chest project became a much-appreciated ministry at St. John?

FaithChests (a trademark of Vibrant Faith Ministries) have been made by many congregations as part of Milestones Ministry. In 2013 Jessica Miller, Director of Youth and Family Ministries at St. John, asked for volunteers to make FaithChests for our baptized, in which they could keep items that are significant in their faith journey. Gaylon Anderson, Roland Enstad and I responded. We visited with other congregations, examined their FaithChests, made several prototypes, and the project was off and running. We have been using the untrademarked title of Faith Chest instead of FaithChest.

Roland became the primary builder, assisted by Wes Myhre, Steve Wennblom and me. Clair Kroke did the finishing. Upon Roland's untimely death and Wes' failing health, the project floundered until Scott Gail took the reins, single-handedly making Chests for a year. When Scott needed a breather, Pastor Brian did some recruiting and Wes and Scott helped turn those reins over to Aanen Gjovik, Mike Lau, Dick Kruta, Tim Magnuson and me. Enough Chests were made in the fall of 2018 to meet our needs for a year, but an increase in summer baptisms forced us back into early summer production. Dick became the builder (also making inventive jigs to simplify

the process), Aanen the tray maker, Mike the finisher (doing an incredible job), Pastor Brian the cheerleader and on-going recruiter, while I have been coordinating our efforts. Steve Wennblom recently re-joined us and a new member, Mike Ellison, will be joining us. If I have forgotten the hands-on contribution of someone, I apologize in advance.

Throughout these six years our Council, congregation, staff and individuals have supported the process financially and by providing the old kitchen for a workshop. Last year our Foundation graciously gave a generous grant to the project. This has enabled us to buy tools and outfit the shop so Chests can be made on-site. This will allow members to assist in the project even if they do not have their own tools or space. Some of us hope the high-quality tools we have purchased will also enable us to make and repair some items around the building, working under the direction of the Property Committee and maintenance staff.

Safety is a primary concern. Protective equipment is available for our crew; the workshop is locked, and the two saws are padlocked for an extra measure to ensure the safety of our members and preschool children.

We "worker bees" thank all of you for your support in helping us to not only do this ministry but in providing the resources for it to continue far into the future. If you would like to help in some way, please contact me, Steve Trandem. at 701-306-8108.
