A Note from the Pastor...

On October 31st of every year, we celebrate The Reformation in the Lutheran Church. This year we have some amazing opportunities to learn from Martin Luther about what the church really means. Luther lived in a time of amazing change, and learned and taught what the real meaning of the church was. Even though Luther grew up in the Roman Catholic Church, he was eventually kicked out of that church, and he had to learn how to worship in new and different ways. Luther made certain that God's message of love became the center of these new ways of worship.

Given the pandemic, we can learn a lot from Luther and The Reformation. No one planned to have worship outside our walls for six months to a year, and it has been a difficult transition. Yet, we have to be careful about the wanting to have things our own way. One of the main lessons of The Reformation is that church is more about the message than the building. The answer of whether we are a church or not depends more upon whether we are proclaiming the gospel than if we are in the building together or not. The difficult lesson for Luther and for his theological descendants is that God is not asking us to find the most comfortable way to do things.

God is asking us to think about life differently. When Jesus talks about the kingdom of God coming near, this means that our lives will be different because God bursts into our neat, tidy little worlds. We had become used to worshipping in certain ways inside our church building, and now God has shown us that this good news exists

outside the building. I don't know how many of us realize that the genius of the Reformation is in Luther's understanding of God's faithfulness to us. When we are claimed by God, God never abandons us. Instead, God is now present with us forever. And, as much as God is presence, God is also calling us, challenging us, inviting us to rethink our lives.

The Reformation means that whether or not you are in church for worship, God is with you. God's message of love for you will never be separated from you. Luther suggested that the church should always be in the process of being reformed. This re-forming, re-imagining, will help us to focus on what the real purpose of the church is: proclaiming the Good News that your loving God has come near, poured grace into you, and this God will never abandon you. This year may be more reason than ever to celebrate this message of The Reformation, and to take to heart Luther's realization that no matter what happens in our world or in our lives, our faithful God comes to us no matter what. Praise be to God!

Special Update from Pastor Erick

October 29, 2020

Dear Members and Friends of St. John,

It is with deep gratitude that I write this letter. We are approaching nearly eight months of living in pandemic mode, and St. John continues to remain a strong, vibrant church. I miss seeing all of you, and I am happy that we have had the opportunity to do Zoom worship and meetings, as well as the chances that weather has provided to meet outside. I wanted to take this opportunity to share with you the financial picture at St. John as well as briefly talk about our plan for opening the building up for worship and other groups.

As I write this, St. John maintains a functional financial position mainly because we secured funding through the Paycheck Protection Program last spring, along with keeping some expenses down. St. John has also been fortunate enough to secure some grant money through the North Dakota Economic Resiliency Grant program in order to help us provide a safer environment for preschool, as well as worship and other groups when we are able to meet. Our finance team had also refinanced our mortgage so that we have financial flexibility going forward.

Yet, our finances are on a trajectory that will be very difficult to maintain without some additional funding. I recognize that the pandemic has impacted everyone's finances in different ways. My hope is that, if you are able, you would consider helping to put St. John back on a more secure financial footing. If you could send a one-time donation, or even increase your regular giving, it would help our finances as we head into the winter. Given that we are uncertain what will happen with outside funding and loans, it is important that we do what we can to stabilize our general fund accounts.

More importantly, I hope you will continue to pray for St. John and its ministries. The leadership and staff have done an amazing job of learning how to continue to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ via computers, telephones, and tablets. We have over 20 weekly opportunities for worship, youth events, book clubs, and other group meetings over Zoom and other platforms. I am so grateful for the talented and flexible staff and the amazing job they have done!! If you haven't yet checked out worship, please do so. We are getting people involved from their own homes, even as we stream live. It's really amazing how the church continues its mission even as we are functioning so differently.

Our reopening plan uses the rate of cases per 10,000 in Cass County. It is similar to the model the Fargo Public Schools also uses. We have put a link to our model on our website and hope you will check it out. Bottom line, the Church Council will use the model on our website to inform our decision making, but may need to take other factors into account. Please continue to check our website for updates.

I'll end this letter as I began, with gratitude. I am so thankful for the ways we have continued to be a thriving community of Christ. While I look forward to seeing everyone again, I know that we will be a strong church throughout this difficult time. Thank you for your prayers and your financial gifts that support our ministry and make it possible to continue to reach more and more people.

"Martin Luther and the Plague (Pandemic)"

In this adult education session, Dr. Roy Hammerling will discuss Martin Luther's 1527 treatise entitled, "Whether One may Flee the Plague?"
